CCPI Funding Opportunity

CCPI = Cooperative Conservation Partnership Initiative

- CCPI Chesapeake Bay Watershed Proposals due by May 24, 2010 (\$1.3 million available in Virginia)
- NRCS will make Environmental Quality Incentives Program
 (EQIP) and Wildlife Habitat Incentive Program (WHIP) funds
 available to owners and operators of agricultural and
 nonindustrial private forest lands in approved CCPI project
 areas. Are the partners interested in making Smith Creek
 Watershed a CCPI project area?

CCPI Funding Opportunity

- This is NOT a grant program. All federal CCPI funds made available to selected CCPI project areas will be paid directly to producers through program contract agreements.
- Projects cannot exceed a period of five years.

PARTNERSHIP STRUCTURE

- **Executive Sponsors** USDA State Executives who champion the showcase watershed, obtain budgets, etc.
- **Sounding Board** local government, landowners, agricultural producers and industry (dairy, poultry, etc.) representatives that provide constructive feedback to the steering committee on project activities and future plans. **Utilize existing TMDL Steering Committee?**

PARTNERSHIP STRUCTURE

- Steering Committee is responsible for the strategic direction and success of the showcase watershed project. Smith Creek Partnership would fill this role. Is this name acceptable to the partnership?
- Core Team is responsible for day-to-day project management. Who should serve in this capacity?
- Project Technical Support Group(s) provide analysis and resource information identified by the Core Team and Steering Committee.
